#### 4. SYSTEM UPDATE

#### A. Report on weekly miles traveled by Ag Vans

Staff reported on the process of how miles are reported using MDT system and reported back to the driver on a weekly basis. Staff also reported an increase in miles traveled compared to last year at this time. Commissioner Richardson asked why it appears that miles are increasing despite the drought. Staff responded that Growers continue to recommend CalVans to their workers.

## B. GIS Report from AMBAG staff showing Salinas Valley areas

This report will allow staff to plot the use of each of their vans in their area. It tracks stops, travels and times, the actual movement of vans in their area. In November, they will be able to see the movement of vans in a 12-month period. GIS report is available to any member agency upon request.



#### C. Vehicle assignment by County/City

This report is compiled every six (6) months. Using travel times and locations this report is broken down by cities and counties. The report can show where vans start and end up, in addition to what additional counties the vans through. However, the report is just a snapshot in time.

#### D. System NTD numbers sorted by UZA and County

This report is a summary of the all the trips in CalVans vans. It reports amount of miles driven, amount of hours it took to do the driving and the distance the passengers were carried. The report is broken down by UZAs and by County, where the vans came out of. This info can assist with compliance with AB 32.

#### E. Hanford Sentinel Article

This article covered the new 3 million dollar grant that was awarded to CalVans.

#### F. Review Year-End financial balance

Year end financial status is on an accrual basis. The agency did well on an 8 million dollar budget. Funding levels are on track for next year.

#### G. Report by Rachel Golden of the UC Berkeley School of Public Policy

This report validates the use of CalVans as a way to get funding into minority areas.

## A. Driver Story on Kerman to Greenfield Trip

This story covers the commute of a Kerman farmworker who commutes to Greenfield daily to pick tomatoes. His contractor pays for the commute for him and his fellow riders.

## B. First 12 of 80 vans arriving

GMC vans that were purchased with the Cap & Trade funds have started to arrive and are currently being retrofitted to meet required specifications. The last of the vans are slated to arrive in December 2015.

## C. Ridership shows significant increase

The data has been tabulated for July and August 2015. Based on comparisons with the same time frame of last year, ridership is increasing. Increased ridership could result in an increase in Federal 5307 funds for local transit agencies.
